- We will update the AAUW California website for easy access to all branch support information.



- Formulates and administers AAUW California's public policy program under the guidance of the state board and within the scope of the national AAUW public policy program
- Evaluates, takes positions, and assigns priority status on legislative and ballot measures
- Assists branches in implementing public policy and voter education programs







What can you expect from the Public Policy Committee this year?

Your AAUW California Public Policy team has four exciting projects planned this year designed to engage and empower our branches in doing mission-based work.





Our VOTER EDUCATION CAMPAIGN will...

Provide branches with the information and tools they need to launch successful Education and GOTV (Get Out the Vote) campaigns in their own communities:

- Weekly social media messages that can go out on branch and individual member's social media platforms
- Voter guides in selected districts that will compare candidate positions on critical AAUW-supported issues
- Information on ballot measures







Our PUBLIC POLICY PRIORITIES UPDATES project will...

- Engage and empower branches to participate in the policy-making process by submitting comments and suggestions to improve the current Public Policy Priorities for 2023-2025.
- When completed, provide branches with a guidepost to use in formulating their own mission-directed programs and projects.
- Inform branches as to the basis for AAUW California's legislative agenda for 2022-2023.

- Since 1888, AAUW has been one of the largest funders of women's graduate education, investing in women who go on to change the world.
- AAUW's funding focuses on women's graduate education leading to professors, administrators, deans, and college presidents.
- The first American Fellow recipient, Ida Street, received \$350 to study early American Indian history.
- The funding has expanded internationally with Fellows currently in over 150 nations.
 - 1890- first European Fellow
 - o 1917 first Latin American Fellow








How does AAUW Fund help your branch?
