Toolkit for Protecting Your School Board from Members Who Support Book Banning, Curriculum Censorship, and Anti-LGBTQ+ Policies

Step #1 – Educate yourself.

- Find a list of resources <u>HERE</u>.
- Attend school board meetings in your local district(s) and complete the School Board Meeting Checklist which can be found <u>HERE</u>.

Step #2 – Seek out qualified candidates to run for open seats, or to challenge regressive members.*

- Make note of school board meeting speakers who share AAUW's values.
- Seek referrals.
 - o Talk to members from your district PTA.
 - o Talk to current board members.
 - **o** Talk to local politicians you may have a relationship with.
 - **o** Talk to like-minded friends who are in other community organizations.
- Once you have identified a potential candidate, approach them to gauge interest. You may find a sample "solicitation" speech <u>HERE</u>.
- If a candidate approaches you for an endorsement or other support, ask them to complete the attached questionnaire for future vetting. It can be found <u>HERE</u>.

Step #3 – If your potential candidate decides to run, support their campaign.*

- Request your branch board to agree to endorse the candidate; post on your branch's website.
- Help your candidate become known in your community.
 - **o** Host a meet-and-greet in your home (as an individual, not as an AAUW member).
 - o Post social media messages of support (to be provided by the state Public Policy Committee).
- Volunteer to work on their campaign.
 - **o** Walk precincts.
 - **o** Distribute flyers.

Step #4 – Speak out at school board meetings.

- You can find a sample script <u>HERE</u>.
- Hand out parent brochures to counter the misleading information about Public Education being spread by other entities.
 - A printable version of the parent brochure can be found <u>HERE</u>. This version will print with vibrant colors, but is not ideal for screen readers. Print as a two-sided document and fold into a tri-fold.
 - For electronic distribution, use the version of the parent brochure that can be found <u>HERE</u>. This version is best for screen readers.

Step #5 – Keep your School Board Project liaison updated on your actions.

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- Items to report:
 - o Name, contact information (phone, email) of potential candidate, school district
 - Activities completed in support of candidate
 - o Attendance at school board meeting
 - Attach copy of completed School Board Meeting Checklist.

Suggested Script for Speaking at School Board Meeting

Suggested script for a two-minute presentation before the school board that is proposing a violation of the State Ed Code, as defined below.

- My name is () and I am a resident in this district. My children/grandchildren attend/attended school in this district (if applicable).
- But today I am speaking on behalf of the American Association of University Women. AAUW supports academic freedom, protection from censorship and bias-free education, as well as access to curriculum that represents historically accurate information.
- According to the California Department of Education: "In California, the State Board of Education decides on the standards for all students..." I point this out to remind you that local school boards do not determine those standards.
- Keeping this in mind, I refer to Ed. Code sect 51204.5: requiring Social Science instruction to include the role and contributions of both men and women, members of various races/ethnic groups, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans, persons with disabilities, and members of other ethnic and cultural groups, to the economic, political, and social development of California and the nation.
- In addition, the updates to Title IX have been released and will take effect on August 1st of this year. These changes clarify and affirm the rights of students to be protected from harassment and/or discrimination based on sex stereotypes, sex characteristics, sexual orientation and/or gender identity, and specifically address discriminatory policies that disproportionately impact trans students. This means that students must have access to facilities in accordance with their gender identity, including bathrooms and locker rooms.
- Actions taken by this board would be construed as a violation of students' First Amendment rights as well as California's constitutional guarantee of the right against discrimination.
- We urge the Board to vote in favor of upholding those rights.

Authority for School Board Candidate Involvement

AAUW Policies and Procedures provide guidelines for involvement by affiliate branches in recruiting and endorsing candidates and for campaign activities. The following are sections pertinent to our work with school board candidates:

AAUW Policies and Procedures: 301 CANDIDATES FOR PUBLIC OFFICE

II. Endorsement of Candidates for Nonpartisan Elective Office

A. A nonpartisan elective office is an office for which party affiliation does not appear on the ballot next to the candidate's name.

B. AAUW affiliates with 501(c)(4) status (the majority of affiliates) may recruit and/or endorse candidates for non-partisan elective offices.

Two Caveats:

- 1. AAUW affiliates that have independently incorporated themselves as 501(c)(3) entities may not endorse candidates for any kind of elected office.
- 2. Before endorsing candidates for nonpartisan elective office, AAUW state affiliate organizations must carefully investigate state and local election laws.

Where state or local election law considers endorsement itself a contribution, AAUW state affiliate organizations may not endorse candidates for any elective office, partisan or nonpartisan.

NOTE: California State Fair Political Practices Commission Regulation (FPPC) 18215 (a) provides that:

A contribution is any payment made for political purposes for which a donor does not receive full and adequate consideration.

• Endorsement is not listed as an activity that is considered a contribution.

IV. AAUW Affiliate's Contributions (AAUW P&Ps)

A. AAUW affiliates may not contribute money, mailing lists, or anything of material value to candidates for any elective office, partisan or nonpartisan.

A. AAUW affiliates may not collectively volunteer time for candidates' activities through an official AAUW affiliate-sponsored activity.*

A. AAUW affiliates may not publish paid or unpaid partisan political announcements or advertisements in any AAUW affiliate publication.

Note: Uncompensated messages on social media are not considered contributions (FPPC Reg 18215.2).

*However, nothing prohibits a member from doing so in their individual capacity.



Scripts for Soliciting School Board Candidates

Script #1: For soliciting names

We are looking for potential candidates who have a background in education, share our values, and have connections to our community. Would you know anyone with those qualifications that I might contact?

Script #2: For potential candidate

Hello, my name is []. I'm a member of the American Association of University Women of California. One of our most important policy priorities is to ensure that all students have access to quality education that incorporates diversity and historically accurate information. We are very concerned about forces in our city that are supporting candidates for next year's school board race who want to censor curriculum and children's access to books that reflect the rich diversity of our state and country, and/or institute policies that may be harmful to LGBTQ+ students. We are looking for candidates who have a background in education, share our values, and have connections to our community.

Your name was given to me by [] as someone with those qualifications who might be interested in running. Once you file and begin your campaign in earnest, members of my organization will be on hand to assist in your campaign by distributing materials, hosting meet-and-greets, etc. We also have access to materials that can help you learn more about running a campaign.

If you will allow me to provide your name and contact information to the Public Policy Committee at AAUW California, someone from their team will contact you to discuss next steps, and provide more details.

Script #3: If you have identified a qualified incumbent who is likely to be challenged

[I have been told] or [I have observed] that as a board member for the [school district] you share our values. May I ask if you are planning to run in 2024? We are concerned about a possible challenger and would like to offer you support in your re-election bid. Once you file and begin your campaign in earnest, members of my organization will be on hand to assist in your campaign by distributing materials, hosting meet-and-greets, etc.
