### **Things to Do**




November has a lot of interesting days: Election Day, Veteran's Day, and Thanksgiving Day. There's also Black Friday. That's when you can buy a wifienabled robotic back scratcher that sings She'll Be Coming 'Round the Mountain When She Comes and fries brussel sprouts for 29 cents. But there's another kind of black day coming right 'round the corner: April 15th. That's when the taxman cometh. You can save on those taxes by making a year-end donation to your favorite charitable organization, ahem. . . us. If you're 73 or older as of January 1, 2023, and don't itemize, you may reduce your taxable income by making a Qualified Charitable Donation from your retirement fund to a qualified 501(c)(3) and even count it as part of your Required Minimum Distribution. Conveniently, we have two suggestions: donate to National AAUW (contact planned-giving@aauw.org) or to an AAUW California program through the AAUW CA Special Projects Fund. Just be sure the donation is paid directly from the IRA to the charity. Small print: Check with your tax advisor. Check with your IRA custodian for the right procedures and paperwork. Check for a better deal on the back scratcher. We saw it for 18 cents.
