LOOKING FOR THE PERFECT HOLIDAY GIFT?

Happy Holidays from my home to yours. Navigating the holidays sometimes feels like an obstacle course as I try to celebrate my own beliefs while being sensitive to others' preferences. Sometimes I get tongue-tied trying to decide whether to say, "Happy Holidays," "Merry Christmas," or "Happy Hannukah" in an effort not to exclude or offend anyone.

This time of the year brings celebrations, opportunities to gather with family and friends. It can also lead to an increased feeling of isolation and loneliness. A 2020 study found that social isolation and loneliness pose serious health risks for the older adult population. Social isolation has been associated with about a 50% increased risk of dementia and other serious health problems.

Do you know someone who might be isolated or lonely?

You can make a difference by giving the gift of caring. Pause the frantic holiday preparations and reach out to a friend, member, or neighbor whose social circle might be small, and share a conversation. One person. One short conversation. One amazing outcome. You'll be astonished at how good this small act of kindness can feel. I encourage you to do it.

Processing Donations

Donations may be made by the member directly or by a branch leader on the member's behalf.

- Donation by member (Preferred): The simplest way for a member to donate directly is online through the Community Hub. This is the easiest and most efficient way to contribute.
- Donation via branch leader. There are two possible ways:
 - The branch leader accesses the Renewals and Donations function in the Community Hub and uses the member's credit card to make an online donation to the AAUW Greatest Need Fund.
 - The branch leader submits the Contribution Report Form with accompanying check(s) from the member(s) or the branch, following these <u>instructions</u>.

You, our Fund chairs, are the heart of AAUW's support. Thank you for encouraging your members to support the unrestricted Greatest Needs Fund. Your dollars matter!

What I need to do: Remind your Fund chairs to watch for an email to register for the December 14th peer group meeting.

MISSING EMAILS??

We never thought we'd say this, but are you getting enough emails?

We routinely hear, "But I didn't get the email!" You can take a couple of steps to be sure you don't miss a single word from AAUW California.

- Check your spam folder. In addition, some email programs take matters into their own hands and preemptively file emails into folders such as "Social" or "Promotions."
- Once you find an errant email, take note of where it was put so you can check there
 periodically.
- Add the domain "@aauw-ca.org" to your email provider's "safe senders" list. Here's <u>how</u>. If your email system's "safe" list requires a full email, add "<u>siteadmin@aauw-ca.org</u>."
- Be aware of when routine communications are scheduled and watch for them. For example, the B2B is published on the 5th of the month and the *California Connection* on the 8th.
- Use your email program's Search function and poke around by subject matter or key word, such as "peer group" or "bylaws" or "reminder."

Don't be in the dark!

B2B Bonus: Quick Tips for Things to Try

You've seen those boxes filled with dark squiggly lines everywhere: menus, fliers, advertisements, etc. These QR codes (which means "Quick Response" in case you were always wondering) are simply an easy way for someone to link to material you'd like them to see easily, especially by just pointing their phone's camera at it. The internet is filled with free tools to easily generate a QR code to place on your communications to link to your website or program announcement flier or whatever. Here's one.

What I need to know: There are some actions you can take to avoid missing emails from AAUW California.

What I need to do: Follow the instructions to update your email settings.

Should I include this in my branch newsletter? Yes, provide them with the instructions to change their settings to be sure of receiving important emails.

Yes, there seems to be so much to know when accounting for a branch's fundraising and programs and reporting it all.

SAVE THE DATE! LOBBY DAYS 2024 WILL BE HELD ON TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY, APRIL 2nd AND 3rd

We encourage all AAUW California members to participate in this act of advocacy that is essential for achievement of our legislative priorities. In addition to our members, we plan to invite college students to join the event. Their participation will enable us to reach more legislative offices, and we hope that this introduction to our organization will inspire these advocacy-minded young people who share our values to join AAUW.

We are planning a hybrid event with meetings scheduled virtually over Zoom as well as in person at the Capitol. Members who live in and around Sacramento will have the option to participate in person. Legislative offices are willing to meet virtually or in person, and the virtual option makes it easier for AAUW members around the state to participate.

Training materials on the bills and the event will be posted on the state website in mid-March, and a mandatory training webinar will be held on March 25th.

Lobby Days provide a wonderful opportunity to meet with your legislators and advocate for legislation to promote gender equity and improve the lives of women and girls. We hope that you will join us in this important activity to advance our values.
