

Demystifying AAUW's Greatest Needs

The Philanthropic Landscape

- Individuals are the largest source of philanthropic giving in the US according to Giving USA's 2023 report, 64% of charitable gifts come from Individuals and 9.1% comes from giving by bequest.
 - 64% of gifts received by AAUW in FY23 came from individuals
 - 29% of gifts received by AAUW in FY23 came from bequests/planned giving
- According to the 2021 Women and Girls Index report (published by IUPUI Women's Philanthropy Institute) philanthropic support for women's and girls' organizations is a mere 1.9% of overall charitable giving.
- According to Giving USA's 2023 report, charitable giving to Education organizations declined in 2022 by 3.6%, and giving to public-society benefit organizations declined by 8.4%




What does it mean to give to AAUW's Greatest Needs?

- <u>Restricted</u> Gifts can only be used to support a specific program or project.





Restricted vs. Unrestricted Assets

- Net Assets Definition: total assets minus all liabilities
- Only 5% of AAUW's Net Assets are unrestricted
- Restricted assets include our generously funded Fellowships, Grants Endowments and other programs such as our Nancy Grace Roman STEM funds and New York Metro area fund.
- Growing Greatest Needs support ensures effective operations, execution of mission-critical work and the long-term sustainability of AAUW.




AAUW Revenue and Expenditures







What is the impact of Unrestricted Giving?



- Solid overhead capabilities make AAUW more resilient to disruptions like pandemics, disasters and economic downturns.
- It empowers AAUW to continue and build missioncritical activities and programs – when restricted funds are not available.
- Stable funding empowers AAUW to focus on longterm planning goals and dedicate resources to research and organizational improvements.
- Ensures AAUW can afford to **pay competitive salaries** to hire and retain employees, which is needed now, more than ever as there is a crisis of attrition affecting the world of nonprofits.

What has been the impact of AAUW's research, education and advocacy work?

AAUW's salary negotiation programs have trained over **190K**

women to negotiate their salaries and benefits to date

NCCWSL 2023 returned in person and welcomed nearly

450 Women Student Leaders

AAUW's STEMEd for Girls provided **200 participants and their caregivers** the opportunity to explore STEM subjects

and careers.

AAUW Activists sent 19,539 letters

to elected officials calling for action on AAUW priorities in 2022.

AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund supported **7 plaintiff cases** in 2022

Since 1888, AAUW has awarded more than **\$140 million** in fellowships, grants and awards to **over 13,000 recipients** from **145 countries**.

Fellowships and grants were awarded to more than \$6M to 320

women and community projects in 2022-23

AAUW's social media messages were seen more than14 million times

across Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and Instagram in 2022

> Hosted more than 58 webinars in 2022

AAUW has a powerful seat at the table to support women and girls – and we are proud of the work we do together







Why is it so important today?

- Dues revenue does not cover the full cost of supporting our membership – over 10,000 of our members (and growing) are Honorary Lifetime members (non-dues paying)
- Fellowships and Grants funding will sustain these restricted programs in perpetuity (forever) – therefore AAUW's Greatest Need is Unrestricted Funds.
- Supporting the sustainability and effective operations of the National organization supports our Branches, F&G Alumnae, Advocates and wider AAUW Community
- Public Policy and Grassroots Advocacy is more important now than ever –the rights of women and girls are under attack.
