


Charmen's Compass Callouts: A message from Charmen Goehring, AAUW California President

Since 1998, more than 16,000 girls have discovered the joys of STEM and friendship at volunteer-powered Tech Trek summer camps—thanks to the support of many of you!

Over 95% of California branches send campers to one of nine camps each year. Some of those attending are even the daughters of past campers!

Now, we're turning up the volume: ramping up to focus not just on teaching STEM skills, but also on the power of community AFTER camp. Because what's better than coding a robot? Coding one with friends who SEE you...



LatinoLand: A Portrait of America's Largest and Least Understood Minority, by Marie Arana (2024).

Recommended by Marty McKnew, AAUW California Governance Chair and Parliamentarian.
