## Take Action - Prop 50 and GOTV

## VOTE & Get Out The Vote (GOTV) Educate About the Positive Impacts of Proposition 50

 Conduct outreach for the special election on November 4, 2025, to educate voters on the logistics of voting and the positive impacts of Proposition 50, focusing on delivering reliable, nonpartisan information.

In an environment that is hyper-partisan and filled with misinformation, you can make a difference by providing California voters with trustworthy, fact-based information, which is currently missing from public discourse.

#### Supporting Proposition 50 is a non-partisan move to:

- Preserve wider democratic norms in California;
- Oppose Project 2025 implementation in California; and
- Allow AAUW California to continue to advance its mission & public policy priorities

## A Take Action NOTE on Prop 50 and GOTV





## NOTE that on THE PROP 50 CAMPAIGN ONLY we should not partner with League of Women Voters (LWV)

- LWV has slightly different priority areas, so cannot make the same arguments about Public Policy Priority areas; and
- LWV is very concerned about the APPEARANCE of partisanship, even in voter education.

Partnership on general GOTV and other matters is otherwise encouraged!



## Take Action - Legislative Agenda

#### Current Status of our 2025 Legislative Agenda: Bill Tracking Report

#### 15 bills of 26 have made it to the Governor's desk, including Priority Bills:

- SB 418: Ensure Equal Access to Care for All
- SB 771: Social Media Platforms Endangering Californians (AAUW CA Sponsored)

#### 4 bills have been signed into law!

- AB 260: Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare
- SB 627: No Secret Police Act (first in the nation!)
- AB 969: CalWORKS requirements waived for Domestic Violence survivors
- SB 640: Automatic CSU admission for CA high school students


#### Gender Pay Gap - Widening?

The gender pay gap has widened for the second consecutive year, continuing a stable or downward trend.

In 2024, all women working full-time, year-round were paid \$0.81 for every dollar paid to men. Pay Gap Data Shows Women Falling Behind; AAUW Steps Up with Solutions – AAUW: Empowering Women Since 1881

#### Gender pay gap narrowed in the 1980s and '90s, but progress has stalled since

## Updates from AAUW National (cont'd)

#### **Department of Education**

- Civil Rights Protections
  - Press Release: <u>AAUW: Government Shutdown and Court-Approved Civil Rights Firings</u>
     <u>Are a Devastating Betrayal of Students AAUW: Empowering Women Since 1881</u>
  - Dept. of Education will fire half of its staff, mostly in the Office of Civil Rights.
     Additional layoffs related to the shutdown are coming.
- Discrimination?
  - Anticipate rules on Title IX (and Title VII) that will officially change the definition of discrimination based on...
    - EOs and other federal rule changes that alter the definition of gender to one based on unscientific findings re: sex
    - Wide application of interpretation of rulings around equality and race-based admissions in <u>Students for Fair Admissions v. Harvard</u>
- Funding-Student Loans
  - Small win: Both chambers want to keep Pell Grants for low income students at the same rate.





## Updates from AAUW National (cont'd)

#### **Federal Nominations**

AAUW continues to formally oppose nominees, including...

- Brittany Panuccio commissioner of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)
  - Senate confirmed Panuccio on October 7th. Republican majority is now established at the agency, and is expected to carry out Trump's civil rights priorities - gutting DEI programs and rolling back protections for transgender workers.
- Kimberly Richey Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights at the Dept of Education

## What Can YOU Do To Resist?

#### Fear & Overwhelm Are A Common Tactic. You Can Resist By...

#### **Sharing the Weight**

- Build Coalitions & Community
  - Work with others who share similar values and goals so that you are working smarter, not harder, and are not duplicating efforts.
  - AAUW CA is doing the same, building coalitions and working in tandem with organizations.
  - You Are Not Alone! Build relationships to share emotional labor and know that you AND the work are supported when you need to take a break.

#### Engage in Collective Action

• When certain kinds of statements or actions are being targeted, it is reasonable to feel afraid. However collective action is critical. It is much harder to target the many.

- Slow down when you need to and take care of your mental and physical well-being.
