

- Shift from siloed advocacy to coalition-building




What is LUPS?

Mission: To advocate for high-quality public education that values diversity, equity, and inclusion


Vision: A vibrant, democratic society of compassionate, well informed, engaged community members





Step One: Change Making

- Small actions add up
- Coalition work is shared work
- Start where you are
- Identify where you live/ Your District
- Local focus increases impact (Pick One)



Step Two: Find Your People

- Reach out to two or three people
- Same district, any background
- Relationships come first
- Attend a board meeting
- Use AAUW CA School Board Project toolkit
- Observe, listen, learn




Step Three: Build Knowledge/Connections

- Who is advocating for public education
- Who sits on the board
- Who is up for election
- Share research
- Align around values
- Support pro-public education candidates together
