Lobby Days 2026 - A New Approach

The main strategy for Lobby Days this year is in-district meetings. A Zoom option is available for those unable to travel to district offices.

This shift was inspired by recent experience.

- Meetings with the Sacramento offices have become very hard to schedule.
- Offices are routinely overbooked.
- Offices tend to avoid committing to meetings until the last minute.
- Almost all recent meetings have been with staff rather than legislators (84 of 94 meetings in 2025).

The Redlands branch did things differently in 2025, and had remarkable results.

- They scheduled 8 in-person meetings with district offices.
- 4 of the 8 meetings were with the legislator and not just staff.

We sent a survey to all members in November, highlighting the Redlands branch experience and success. Members overwhelmingly indicated that they would like to follow the Redlands model and meet with district offices.

The Teams

This year there are 180 Lobby Days participants. They have been placed into 43 teams:

- 30 In-district teams meeting with 57 offices
- 13 Zoom teams meeting with 36 offices

Teams were formed based on:

- Member's preferred format - In-district vs Zoom
- Shared legislators
- Branch members were kept together where possible

Where a legislator had some constituents who signed up for in-district meetings and others who signed up for Zoom, the in-district team was given preference. This means some Zoom teams will meet with legislators who are not their own.

Some participants are the only member of a particular district. A few teams consist of several such people, i.e. these teams will meet with a few different offices.

Teams are as small as 2 people and as large as 16.

Team Member Roles - Core vs Optional

Team assignments were made to ensure that every participant has the opportunity to meet with both of their legislators.

- Core Members
 - Have an active speaking role in the meeting
 - May present information about branch activities and/or priority bills
- Optional Members
 - Do not typically have a speaking role, unless the core team is small
 - Are invited to join for the opportunity to meet their legislator, show AAUW's strength in the district, and support the core team
- Dual Members
 - A few people are core members on two teams - one in-district and one Zoom

Team Leader Responsibilities

Scheduling & Communication

- Schedule district office meetings directly with legislative offices
- Zoom meetings will be scheduled by Public Policy team - no action needed by Team Leader
- Serve as main point of contact with Lobby Days Committee
- Confirm team members' availability and ensure everyone has meeting details (date, time, location, or Zoom link)

Team Coordination & Preparation

- Assign Core Team Members their speaking roles. (Optional members do not speak unless the team is small.)
- If your team is large, rotate speakers between your two meetings.
- Check whether your legislator serves on committees hearing the priority bills (details to follow).
- Meet with your team in advance to confirm roles and conduct a brief dry run.

Team Leader Responsibilities (cont'd)

During the Meeting

- Lead introductions and present AAUW overview
- Guide member presentations of AAUW branch activities
- Thank the legislator for their leadership and support of shared values and AAUW priorities, as applicable
- Guide member presentations of priority bills
- Request a group photo, deliver closing thanks, and collect contact information for follow-up

After the Meeting

- Send a thank-you email
- Complete the Visit evaluation, noting any questions, concerns or requests for information raised during the meeting.

Lobby Days 2026 – Advocate for Bills to Advance AAUW Values

JANUARY 2, 2026

This year we're introducing a new approach to Lobby Days that prioritizes in-district meetings. As we transition to this model, we will also keep a zoom meeting option for members who are unable to travel to in-district meetings. This shift was inspired, in part, by our recent trials and tribulations with Lobby Days meetings in Sacramento. Over the past two years, it has become increasingly difficult to secure meetings with legislative offices in the capital as they are routinely overbooked with meetings tending to be confirmed at the last minute, short (most last no more than 15 minutes), and held with staffers rather than legislators (84 of 94 in 2025).

This shift to in-district meetings for Lobby Days was also inspired, in part, by the experiences of the Redlands Branch, who took a different approach and saw remarkable results. By scheduling Lobby Days in-district, they were able to secure eight in-person meetings. These meetings were confirmed well in advance, were longer, and offered a much better chance of speaking directly with legislators. We highlighted their success in our November Public Policy survey, and members overwhelmingly indicated a preference for meeting with district offices.

Scheduling: Zoom Meetings

- Team Leaders do not need to reach out to legislative offices.
- Public Policy Committee will schedule Zoom meetings and provide the day/time details and meeting links.
- Meeting dates: April 8-10, 2026

Scheduling: District Office Meetings

Team Leaders are responsible for scheduling District office meetings.

Use the Meeting Request form on the legislator's website

- Look for "Contact" at the top bar on the website
- On the pull-down menu under "Contact", select "Meeting Requests" or "Scheduling Requests"
- You will see a choice of "Meeting Request" and "Event Request". Select "Meeting Request"
- Fill in the requested information
 - Name of Organization: AAUW California
 - Purpose of Meeting: AAUW California Priority Legislation
 - Bill Number: TBD(2 of the bill numbers will be available week of Feb 9th)
 - Position: Support
 - Have you Met with Staff About This? No
 - Attendees:
 - Fill in all team member names - Core and Optional
 - Be sure to check the box "Attendee Is A Constituent"
 - Check the box at the bottom "Add Attendee" to add additional names

Remember - Including all of the constituent names significantly strengthens your request



Scheduling: District Office Meetings (cont'd)

Fill in the requested information

- Date/Time & Location
 - Enter the first requested date/time
 - Check the box that "Dates And Times Are Flexible"
 - Enter all other possible dates/times
 - Preferred Location Of Meeting: Select the District Office
 - Additional Comments: "Our AAUW Branch Members are excited to meet with Senator/Assemblymember (Name) and are hopeful we can get on their calendar soon."



Scheduling: District Office Meetings (cont'd)

Start submitting your meeting requests on February 9, 2026.

- Recommended meeting window: March 27-April 17, 2026
 - Spring recess: March 26-April 6 - Some legislators take district meetings during this time
 - During session: Legislators are often available for Thursday afternoon, Friday, and occasionally Saturday meetings
 - Alternatively, consider inviting the legislator to a branch meeting

Once your meeting is scheduled:

- **Finalize the participant list** - Confirm which of your team members can and cannot participate
- **Reach out to the Legislative Office to give them an updated list of all expected participants**

A Note to Large Teams: Some offices may not have the space to accommodate your group. In this case, you may have to split your group up - one group to meet with your Assemblymember and the other group with your Senator.

This is our first year trying this new approach, and we may not have anticipated every detail. We appreciate your flexibility and understanding.

Scheduling: District Office Meetings (cont'd)

In addition to submitting the online meeting request form:

- Many of you have relationships with the legislative offices. If so, leverage your relationships! Reach out to a staff member you know and ask if they can help facilitate scheduling the meeting.
- Or, if you don't know anyone in the office, ask for the district director and make the same request.
- Let them know that you submitted an online meeting request form. Emphasize that you have a group of constituents that are requesting the meeting. The more constituents you have in your group, the more compelling the request.

We believe that focusing our efforts on in-district meetings will greatly improve our chances of meeting with the legislators. However, please keep in mind:

- Meetings with legislators are challenging to obtain. Despite all your best efforts, your meeting may end up being a Zoom meeting, and/or may be with the staff rather than the legislator. If so, remember that meetings with staff are still valuable and are an important way to build relationships and advance AAUW California's priority legislation.

A few words of wisdom from Cassie MacDuff of the Redlands branch who had great success last year scheduling in-district meetings.
