AB 2843 eliminates cost-sharing, including deductibles, from being imposed on any rape survivor seeking medical care following a rape. Forensic exams and rape kits are free, however, other costs associated with an ER visit are not for those with private insurance. AB 2843 ensures that those individuals who wish to report a rape and file charges will have the benefit of a rape kit test and forensic exam to provide evidence to secure more convictions for acts of sexual violence. Moreover, they can receive the care that they need following a traumatic sexual attack.
